
Regional Neuroscience & Society Meetups

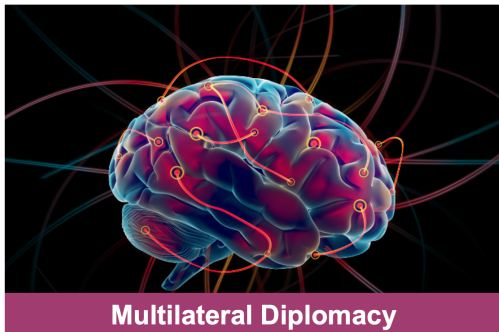

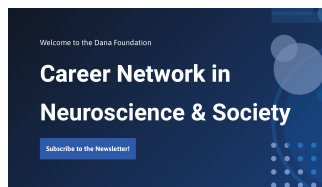
